YOUR ROLL-OUT CARTS

These carts are being provided to improve the quality of your collection service by:

- Keeping papers, odors, refuse, etc., in the cart ... the elements and animals out
- Improving your community's appearance
- Providing a quiet, easy to handle container to store and move refuse
- Offering a safe, convenient and effective way to handle household waste

Your new Cascade Carts are made of durable, extra strength, injection-molded plastic and equipped with features like a dual bottom wear strip, heavy-duty wheels and axles to ensure years of dependable service. The following safe use and care guidelines will help you get the most out of your new roll-out carts.

Your recycling cart will have a recycling schedule on the inside of the lid. Your recycling cart will be marked with either an "A Section" or "B Section" at this place in your cart.

LOADING YOUR CARTS

To place garbage or recyclables in your carts, always lift the lid from the front. Be careful to not overload your carts in excess of your ability to safely maneuver them.

Do not place the following in your carts:

- Paint
- Oil
- Sand
- Solvents
- Hot ashes
- Rocks
- Acids
- Medical waste
- Soil
- Gasoline
- Exposed needles

PLACING YOUR CARTS FOR COLLECTION

Make sure the lids are closed on your carts. Then, for each cart, grab the handle and use the convenient "tilt and go" design feature (between the wheels at the rear of the cart), and tilt the cart back slightly. Now, safely and easily push or pull the cart. The carts are designed to withstand dragging, however, for ease of use, tilt and roll. Don't forget, always close the lid before moving, and on inclines pull the cart uphill and push the cart down hill!

On your collection day, place your carts on your easement, behind the curb, with the handle of the carts facing your house. Always keep the lids closed. Put your carts out by 7 a.m. on your trash day or after 5 p.m. the night before. Leave three feet between your trash and recycle carts.

Do not place your carts close to obstructions such as mailboxes, utility poles, fire hydrants or parked cars.

AFTER COLLECTION

Remove your empty carts from the curb by midnight. Store them on your property. Ideally, store them inside or behind your garage or behind your house. If that is not possible, store them away from your neighbors' houses as much as possible and try to keep them out of sight from the front sidewalk.

Do not store your cart close to a furnace, grill or other source of excessive heat.

CARING FOR YOUR CARTS

Your new carts are designed for ease of maintenance. To clean, simply rinse your carts with water from time to time, let them dry in sunlight with the lid open.
